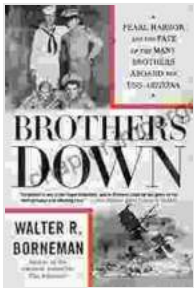


Pearl Harbor: The Fate of the Many Brothers Aboard the USS Arizona

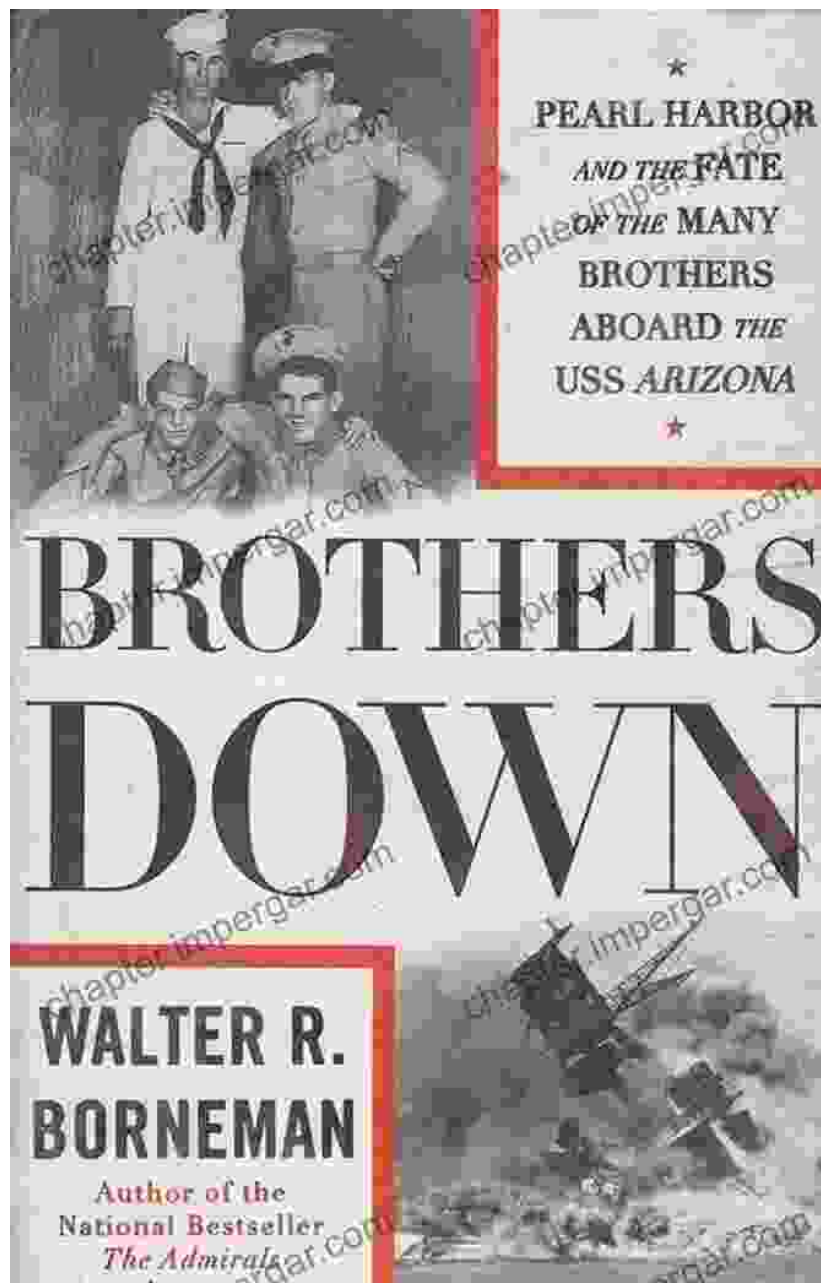

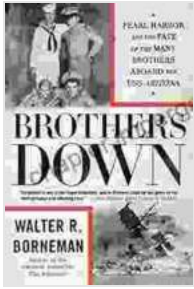
