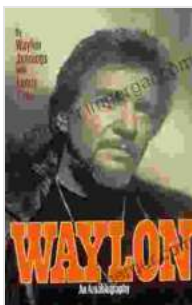

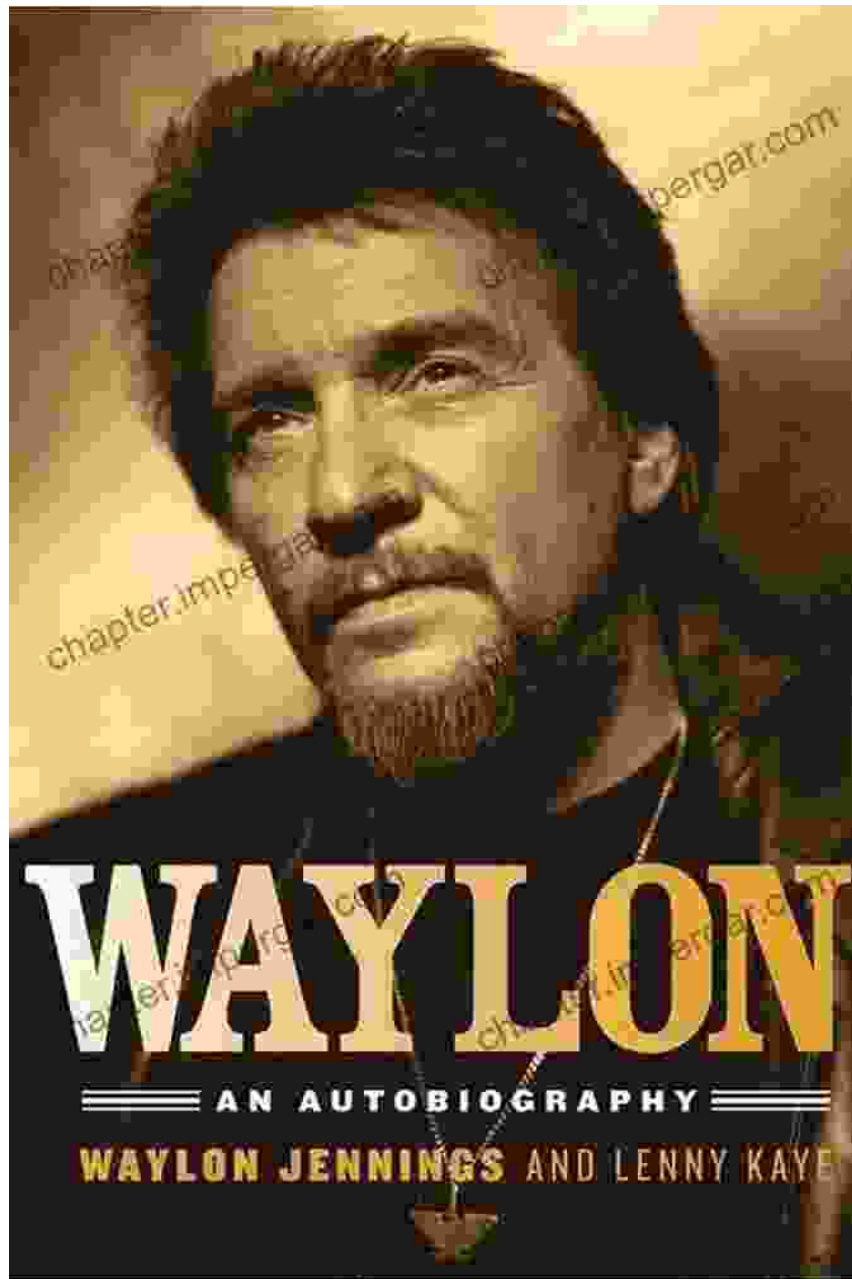

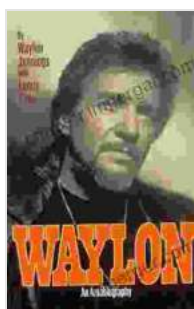
About Waylon Jennings
